OUR WORK

Gender-based violence - such as domestic abuse and sexual assault - is far more common than many would like to believe. As the only non-profit organization dedicated to sering victims and survivors of gender-based violence in Westmoreland County, Blackburn Center is devoted to ensuring that our clients get the services that they need to heal. Through our community programs, we also strive to eliminate the root causes of this type of violence.

We work with clients who have experienced any type of violence, abuse. and crime, including domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse., stalking, elder abuse, and human trafficking. Our services are or can be accessible. They are available to anyone in Westmoreland County who has experienced this type of violence or crime. We strive to provide an inclusive, affirming environment.

We offer a range of direct client services, all of which are provided at no cost to clients. All of our services are trauma-informed, which means that we incorporate an understanding of how trauma affects the life of a victim or survivor to help them rebuild a sense of control and empowerment. Our client services include:

- A 24-hour hotline that provides crisis counseling to victims, survivors, and their loved ones. Calls to the hotline can be anonymous. 1-888-832-2272 (TDD Available)
- An emergency shelter for victims of intimate partner violence and their children, where they can stay in a safe, comfortable haven and plan for their future.
- Counseling and therapy, which are available in-person, over the phone and virtually.
- Support groups, facilitated by Blackburn Cenbter staff, where participants can explore their strengths, resources, and options.
- Medical advocacy/accompaniment where we provide support and information at hospitals and medical facilities, including meeting victims of domestic and sexual violence at emergency rooms at any time of the day or night.

OUR SERVICES CONTINUED

- Legal systems support, where we accompany victims of violence or crime to hearings, trials and other significant court dates and provide support, encouragement, and information.
- Blackburn Center Legal, which provides civil legal services for victims and survivors of crime. These services may include matters such as divorce, child custody, public benefits, Protection from Abuse petitions, bankruptcy, or other issues related to victimization.

Each year, we provide direct client services to thousands of people throughout Westmoreland County. For example, in 2022-2023, Blackburn Center answered 1,732 hotline calls, provided shelter to 120 adults and children. We also had 1,814 legal advocacy contacts and 103 medical advocacies during this time.

Beyond direct client services, Blackburn Center also works in the community to achieve our ultimate goal of ending this type of violence. This work is known as primary prevention: instead of simply responding to violence, abuse, and crime, we hope to address the root causes by raising awareness and educating the public. We offer free educational programs to schools, community organizations, and other entities, and work directly with local universities on special projects. We also provide free educational materials for parents and educators (available on our website), attend fairs and community events, and host our own annual event: Walk a Mile in Her Shoes ®. In 2021-2022 alone, 14,859 students and teachers across Westmoreland County participated in awareness programs put on by our education team. We cannot do this work alone. We are grateful for your support, as well as the hard work of our staff and volunteers.
