As the Victim Services agency for Westmoreland County, our mission is to provide vital support and services to survivors and victims of domestic and sexual violence and other forms of violence. In 2023 alone, we supported 2,832 new clients and answered 1,882 hotline calls. Throughout the year, we were dedicated to offering assistance and resources to individuals facing all forms of violence and crime.

This past fiscal year, Blackburn Center provided 4,861 shelter days to 129 adults and their dependent children at our emergency shelter. We also provided counseling and therapy, facilitated support groups, and advocated for survivors and victims through our medical and legal programs. Our staff and volunteers actively engaged in the community, and provided support in local hospitals, the Westmoreland County Courthouse, and across 16 Magisterial District Court locations.

In addition to direct services, we provided educational awareness programs for thousands of students and teachers this year, and we offered in-service trainings for professionals, including businesses and community organizations. Throughout the year, Blackburn Center staff participated in health fairs and community events, providing valuable information and resources.

As we strive to maintain our full range of services, it's important to acknowledge that both government and nongovernment funding for our work have been impacted by widespread budget cuts affecting many nonprofits.

Save the date – April 26, 2025 The 14th annual Walk a Mile in her Shoes event will take place at St. Clair Park in Greensburg.


